

CULTURALLY INCLUSIVE EDUCATOR CERTIFICATE





The Culturally Inclusive Educator

Certificate (CIEC) program is designed for people teaching, training, facilitating or advising in the public and private sector. The certificate is comprised of five courses to help strengthen and enhance participants' intercultural knowledge, communication, curriculum development and differentiated teaching skills when teaching and supporting international higher education students. Upon completion of the certificate, participants

Each course is offered over three classes (for a total of 15 weeks) in the fall, winter, and spring/summer semesters. Upon successful completion of the five courses, participants receive a Certificate of Completion.

This Certificate has been accredited by the Society for Teaching and Learning in Higher Education (STLHE) - Educational Developers Caucus (EDC) of Canada to ensure quality in teaching and learning and is under review to receive the Learning Teaching and Assessing accreditation award by the Staff and Educational Development Association (SEDA) of the United Kingdom to ensure quality and alignment in teaching and learning values and philosophies.

COURSES OFFERED:

IIE.001 Intercultural Context

This course provides an introduction to the exploration of cultural values and internationalization at the postsecondary level and how they intersect within the academic environment. Self-assessment of identity and cultural values will preface all discussion and reflection. Participants will also explore strategies and activities for moving through the stages of intercultural sensitivity within the classroom.

IIE.004 Understanding Students in Transition

This course explores the experience of international students in their transition to post-secondary academic life in Canada. Participants will learn about trends in international student demographics and motivations for pursuing education abroad. Participants will explore stages and symptoms of transition that students commonly encounter as they navigate towards cultural and academic adaptation in a new environment. Upon completion of the course, participants will have developed a framework of actions they can take to provide appropriate support for students in transition.

IIE.002 Intercultural Communication

This course explores the connection between culture and communication for educators. Participants will begin with an assessment of their self/cultural identity and the assumptions that influence their behaviour and interactions with others. Students will explore barriers to intercultural communication and examine cultural domains and how they impact communication and behaviours in the classroom. Through case studies, writings and film, students will explore communication norms of other cultures. The course will enable participants to understand their interpersonal communication techniques, facilitate dialogue between students, and provide responsive resolutions to cultural communication conflict in the classroom.

IIE.005 Supporting Language Acquisition

Gain practical experience in supporting language acquisition of English language learners in your classroom. Participants will acquire the fundamentals in secondlanguage acquisition theory and the development of realistic language-learning goals for students. Participants will discover how to monitor the form of their own language and supply language-related feedback. Participants will identify useful language-related resources for learners, discern the challenges faced by secondlanguage learners, and design activities that incorporate opportunities for planning and practicing language.

IIE.003 Intercultural Curriculum

This course explores ways to build a more globalized teaching practice and support international students in the classroom.

A global education approach to teaching focuses on the students' place in the world community. This focus enriches the student experience by connecting curriculum to real life, and understanding the connections among people, cultures and environments. Participants will explore how their teaching and learning practice can integrate the social, economic, environmental, and political aspects of our world no matter what the subject content.

INCLUSIVE DESIGN CERTIFICATE



Inclusive Design encompasses the key elements of multiple teaching and learning approaches to offer a robust and accessible learning experience for all students. The principles of inclusive curriculum design focus on a proactive rather than reactive approach to course design and are founded in equity, collaboration, flexibility and accountability. This Certificate addresses the idea that students are not meant to fit into a traditional "one size fits all" model of education and that applying the principles of inclusive design will ensure that the range of student diversities, abilities, and needs are being met through a number of teaching and learning strategies.

The Certificate is comprised of seven 3-hour learning modules, a coaching session, and a reflection activity. Upon successful completion of these components, participants receive a Certificate of Completion.

COURSES OFFERED:

Module 1: Foundations of Inclusive Design

This module explores the role of inclusive design in optimizing the experience of all learners. Participants will be introduced to the universal design for learning (UDL) guidelines, which will be applied throughout the Inclusive Design Certificate program. Participants will also explore the post-secondary student experience through discussion and simulation and will reflect on the importance of adopting inclusive design practices.

Module 2: Engaging Students

This module explores the impact of inclusive design on student engagement with a focus on active learning strategies that are effective for adult learners. Participants will 'learn by doing' as they discuss, reflect, and develop ways to engage their students.

Module 3: Planning Instruction Part One

This module introduces the fundamentals of planning instruction with a focus on inclusive design principles. Participants will discuss and reflect on barriers faced by students, and the importance of using learning outcomes to achieve flexible curriculum alignment.

Module 4: Planning Instruction Part Two

This second "Planning Instruction" module continues to explore the application of inclusive design principles to reach all learners. Participants will discuss and apply strategies for proactive, student-focused course and lesson design, including the creation of accessible documents.

Module 5: Assessing Learning Part One

This module introduces the fundamentals of assessment with a focus on authentic and differentiated assessment to maximize student achievement and engagement.

Participants will explore assessment

types and the importance of motivation when creating authentic and inclusive assessments.

Module 6: Assessing Learning Part Two

This second "Assessing Learning" module continues to explore the fundamentals of assessment. Participants will discuss strategies and tools to measure learning outcomes and revise their own assessments to integrate inclusive design principles. This module will also focus on inclusive design strategies that can reduce the need for in-class and testing accommodations by making classroom tasks and assessments accessible to all learners.

Module 7: Technology to Support Inclusive Design

This module explores technology that can support inclusive design and engage learners in a meaningful way. Participants will experience engaging software from both the student and instructor perspective, and will learn about the supports provided by the Centre for Teaching and Learning, including the Creative Studio and our Educational Technology Specialist.

The Teaching Effectiveness Certificate

program is designed for those interested in the field of teaching or private sector training. The courses within this certificate program provide participants with an opportunity to explore best practices in teaching and learning and to apply the skills learned in a safe environment with other classmates.

The certificate is comprised of five individual courses that are designed to develop essential teaching competencies.

This Certificate has been accredited by the Society for Teaching and Learning in Higher Education (STLHE) - Educational Developers Caucus (EDC) of Canada to ensure quality in teaching and learning and is under review to receive the Learning Teaching and Assessing accreditation award by the Staff and Educational Development Association (SEDA) of the United Kingdom to ensure quality and alignment in teaching and learning values and philosophies.

Courses are delivered over twelve Saturdays (9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.) or are available online. Upon successful completion of the five courses, participants receive a Certificate of Completion:

COURSES OFFERED:

DEV.101 Creating a Positive Learning Environment

Creating a positive learning environment is the cornerstone of effective teaching. This course examines effective teaching and learning practices and explores strategies to engage adult learners in a variety of diverse educational settings. The participants will explore strategies for the promotion and maintenance of positive physical, instructional, and psychological climates for learning. The main goal of this course is to provide participants with teaching techniques and skills necessary to become an effective teacher.

DEV.102 Learning Technology

The purpose of this course is to explore how various forms of technology can be used to create an effective learning environment. Participants will be able to explain a rationale for choosing specific types of technology in the design of a course or training session. Participants will be exposed to of a variety of technology resources and assess their value in education.

DEV.103 Preparing for Instruction

Preparing for instruction examines the importance of preparation and planning in a teaching and learning environment. This course introduces participants to the benefits of structured lesson plan design that reflects various domains and levels of learning. Participants will design a lesson plan that includes activating, acquiring, applying and assessing knowledge that aligns with course outcomes and learning objectives.

DEV.104 Evaluating Techniques

Evaluation Techniques explores the various elements in designing and evaluating student assessments that align with course and learning outcomes. Participants will explore the rationale for selecting specific formal and informal strategies of assessment for/as/of learning. Techniques for giving effective feedback, and creating

authentic and differentiated assessments will be examined. Participants will design an assessment and a corresponding rubric to assess learning.

DEV.105 Delivering Instruction

Delivering Instruction represents the culmination of the knowledge, skills, and abilities acquired throughout the Teaching Effectiveness Certificate. Active learning strategies and the differentiated instruction approach will be practiced experientially to assist participants in improving their teaching practice. Participants will deliver two mini lessons to their peers and have the opportunity to give and receive constructive feedback in a safe and positive learning environment.
