Building Student Success Through LEGO



Internationally Inclusive Educator Certificate (IIEC) 09971

The program is composed of 5 key areas that are designed to develop essential teaching and learning competencies for supporting International higher education students.

Courses Offered:

IIE.001

Intercultural Context

Explore cultural values and how they impact the academic environment. This course will examine domains of culture including power orientation, individualism/collectivism, uncertainty avoidance and how they may impact communication and behavior in the classroom. Participants will practice strategies and activities for supporting students through the stages of intercultural development.

IIE.002

Intercultural Communication

This course explores the connection between culture and communication for educators and trainers. Participants will begin with a selfassessment of their assumptions that influence their behaviour and interactions with others. Participants will explore barriers to intercultural communication. Through case studies, writings and film, participants will explore communication norms across cultures. The course will enable participants to understand their interpersonal communication techniques, facilitate dialogue between students, and provide responsive resolutions to cultural communication conflict in the classroom.

IIE.003 Intercultural Curriculum

This course explores methods for developing curricula and teaching practice within a global perspective. A global education approach to teaching focuses on the students' place in the world community. This focus enriches the student experience by connecting curriculum to real life, and understanding the connections among peoples, cultures and environments. Participants will explore how their teaching and learning can integrate the social, economic, environmental, and political aspects of our world no matter what the subject content.

IIE.004

Understanding Students in Transition

Trying to navigate a new classroom environment can be challenging for some International students. After a period of initial euphoria, students transition through stages as they navigate towards cultural adaptation. In this course you will learn how to identify the stages of cultural adaptation and help students recognize and adjust to: culture shock, new classroom norms, group work and assessments. This course will enable participants to gain a better understanding of the needs of new International higher education students and how to best support them in the classroom.

IIE.005

Supporting Language Acquisition

Gain practical experience in supporting language acquisition of English language learners in your classroom. Participants will gain a basic understanding of the theories of second-language acquisition and the development of realistic language-learning goals for students. Participants will learn how to monitor the form of their own language and provide language-related feedback. Participants will identify useful languagerelated resources for learners and design activities that include opportunities for planning and practicing language.
